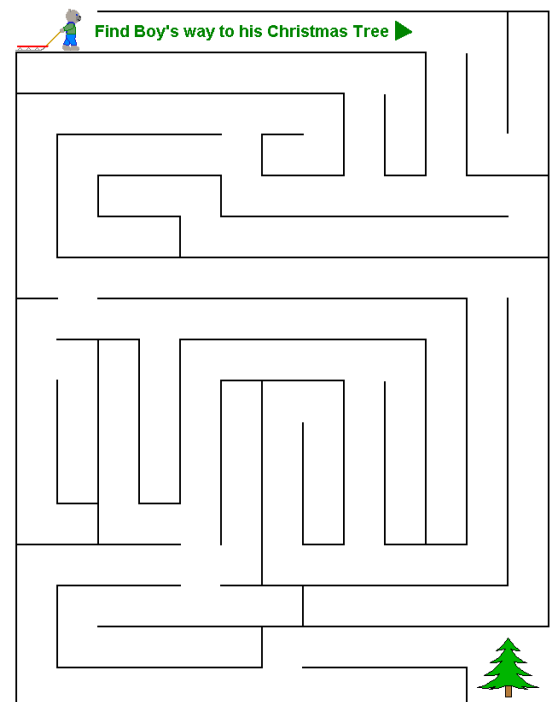
The little boy replied, "I got him from the church."
